



INCLEMENT WEATHER

Rule 5.7b Governs when play is suspended by the Committee.

- (1) If the committee declares an immediate suspension of play due to a dangerous situation (one prolonged horn blast), a player must not make a stroke until the committee resume play.
- (2) If the committee suspends play for normal reason (three consecutive horn blasts) and the players in a group are between the play of two holes, they must stop play and must not make a stroke to begin another hole until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If they have started play of a hole, they may discontinue play immediately or continue play of the hole, provided they do so without delay. If the players choose to continue play of the hole, they are permitted to discontinue play before completing it. In any case, play must be discontinued after the hole is completed. The players must resume play when the Committee has ordered a resumption of play.

Penalty for breach of Rule 5.7b: Disqualification

SUSPENSION AND RESUMPTION OF PLAY SIGNALS:

Immediate suspension of play (dangerous situation) – One prolonged blast of horn

Normal suspension of play (non-dangerous situation) – Three consecutive blasts of horn

Resumption of play – Two short blasts of horn

CONTINGENCY PLAN:

- The tournament will be shortened to an 18-hole competition, should a morning or afternoon group fail to complete a round due to inclement weather conditions.
- If it occurs during the **first two (2) days**, Thursday or Friday, the last two (2) days will be considered for each team's 18-Hole score.
- If it occurs during the **last two (2) days**, Saturday or Sunday, the completed scores on the first round will count, regardless of the course played.
- Awards will be on per course basis.
