JUNIOR INTER-CLUB STROKEPLAY CHAMPIONSHIP 2026

CONDUCT OF PLAY

1.) RULES OF GOLF

The PLAY Golf Interclub Strokeplay Championship shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as adopted by the R&A Rules Limited and any Local Rules as approved by the Tournament Committee.

2.) ELIGIBILITY

Juniors who are members and dependents of their golf club are eligible to participate. The Club's General Manager or Golf Director must sign the team form of players that each golf club will field. Proof of General Manager or Golf Director's authenticity is required

- Class A - Open to boys and girls who are not yet 19 as of October 30, 2026.
- Class B - Open to boys and girls who are not yet 15 as of October 30, 2026.
- Class C - Open to boys and girls who are not yet 13 as of October 30, 2026.
- Class D - Open to boys and girls who are not yet 11 as of October 30, 2026.
- Class E - Open to boys and girls who are not yet 9 as of October 30, 2026.

3.) TOURNAMENT FORMAT

TEAM: The Play Golf Junior Interclub Championship will consist of 54 holes of play. Each team can have a maximum of 6 junior players and a minimum of 4 players. The team score for each day will be based on the total of the best 4 scores. The two worst scores from each team will not be included in the total score for the day. Prizes will be awarded to the top 5 teams.

There will be three divisions. The team handicap will be determined by the average handicap of the 4 lowest handicaps from the player roster, using the NGAP WHS System as of October 1, 2026

Any changes to your team line-up must be submitted by October 20, 2026 at 5 PM.



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TEAM COMPOSITION & DIVISIONS:

Clubs may field one team per division based on the team's average handicap.

- Division 1: Team average handicap below 4
- Division 2: Team average handicap 4 – 8
- Division 3: Team average handicap above 8

INDIVIDUAL: All players who are part of the different teams will have their age bracket divisions where each juniors daily score will be counted. Top 5 players per age bracket will be awarded.

Class ABCD (JGS)

Class E - max score double par

54-hole individual stroke play for all divisions. ***Must hole out.***

4.) AWARDS

TEAM: Trophies will be given to the top 3 teams of each division and medals will be awarded to all the members of the winning teams.

INDIVIDUAL: Medals will be given to the top 5 players per age bracket. Awards will be given to the top 1 WAGR Boys and top 1 WAGR Girls.

Awarding will take place at the clubhouse following the conclusion of the tournament.

5.) ENTRY FEE: 39,000 per team

6,500 per player - individual entry

Free 1 Practice Round - October 27, 2026

Priority for entry shall be given to clubs that have registered a complete team. Individual entries will be considered thereafter, based on available slots and at the sole discretion of the Tournament Committee.

6.) CLASSIFICATION AND TEE MOUNDS - age as of October 30, 2026.

- ***The specific tee lengths will be set according to the difficulty appropriate for each age group, ensuring fairness and competitiveness.***

7.) CARTS AND CADDIES

Caddie fee - ₱700 minimum

Personal caddies are allowed only for 8 years old and under but players still have to pay for the caddie on deck.

No caddies on the green for 9 years old and above.

Golf Cart 2 Seater ₱1,100

Class E players are permitted to use golf carts. Only personal caddy or club caddy (if no personal caddy) can drive the cart. Golf cart rental under the player's account.

Gallery Fee ₱500 (includes insurance)

Due to the limited number of carts, players will have priority when getting a cart. *Galleries who would like to rent a cart will be on a first come first serve basis.*



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8.) DISTANCE-MEASURING DEVICES

A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures **distance only**. The use of a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect a player's play, such as gradient or wind speed is not permitted.

Penalty for breach: Disqualification

9.) RECORDING OF SCORES

Each player will be assigned as "marker" to record the score of another player in the same group. The marker shall be responsible for recording the player's correct score after each hole. After completion of the round the player shall:

- a) Check his/ her hole-by-hole score for accuracy.
- b) Settle any doubtful points with the Committee.
- c) Ensure that his/ her marker has signed his/ her card.
- d) Countersign the card him/ herself.

10.) SUBMISSION OF SCORECARDS

Scorecards must be signed at the scoring table in the clubhouse within 15 minutes after the player holes out from their last hole. The scorecard is deemed officially submitted once the player has left the scoring table.

11.) TIES

TEAM: In case of ties for the championship, the team with the lowest score from the 5th player (from the non-counting scores) will win. If still tied, the 6th player (from the non-counting scores) If still tied, coin toss. If no 5th and 6th player, that team concedes.

In the event of a tie for 2nd to 5th, the team with the lowest score from the 5th player (from the non-counting scores) will win.

INDIVIDUAL: In case of ties for 1st, players will do a playoff until a winner is determined.

In the event of a tie for 2nd to 5th, countback starting from hole 18, 17, 16, 15 and so on.

12.) PACE OF PLAY

Players are expected to maintain a reasonable pace of play throughout the round. Slow play may result in penalties as determined by the tournament committee.

13.) CODE OF CONDUCT

Players are expected to adhere to the highest standards of sportsmanship and etiquette. Any form of cheating, unsportsmanlike conduct, or violation of the rules may result in disqualification. Respect for fellow competitors, officials, and the golf course is paramount.

14.) COMPLIANCE WITH WAGR GUIDELINES

The tournament will adhere to the guidelines and requirements set forth by the World Amateur Golf Ranking (WAGR) for inclusion and recognition of results.

All necessary information and documentation will be submitted to WAGR in a timely manner following the conclusion of the tournament.

15.) COMPLIANCE WITH JUNIOR GOLF SCOREBOARD (JGS) GUIDELINES

The tournament will adhere to the guidelines and requirements set forth by Junior Golf Scoreboard (JGS) for inclusion and recognition of results.

All necessary information and documentation will be submitted to JGS in a timely manner following the conclusion of the tournament.



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16.) CANCELLATION/WITHDRAWAL POLICY

A player can withdraw during a round only because of injury or other disability requiring medical attention or serious personal emergency. Once a round is completed and his scorecard is signed, a player can withdraw for any reason and without explanation.

Refunds will not be granted for cancellations and withdrawals after the tournament registration deadline.

17.) TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE / OFFICIALS

The Tournament Committee / Officials will be responsible for the administration of the competition and reserves the right to amend the Conditions of Play before the start of the tournament. Revisions will be posted on the player information board. Disputes, if any, will be settled by the Tournament officials, headed by the tournament director, whose decisions shall be final. The competition shall be deemed closed when the Championship trophy has been presented.

18.) WEATHER AND COURSE CONDITION

The tournament will be played unless course conditions or severe weather make it unsafe or impossible to proceed.

If play is suspended due to weather, the tournament director will provide further instructions, and a decision regarding whether the tournament will be rescheduled will be made based on the prevailing conditions.

19.) LIABILITY

Participants and their guardians acknowledge and accept all risks involved in the tournament, including potential injury, and agree to release the tournament organizers, golf club, and officials from any liability.
